# **Principal's Report**

Firstly, I would like to thank all parents, students and staff for a successful Term 1 so far. The return to full time onsite schooling after an interrupted 2020 was likely to pose some challenges in terms of settling students back into the routine of school life. Parents can continue to support our work by ensuring students are in full school uniform, are on time at the start of the school day and are also equipped with the materials they need for classes.

The College is in a fantastic position to support families in terms of uniform and equipment and can contact the relevant sub school should they require assistance.



#### In classes – Common Assessment Tasks and continuous improvement

In Years 7 to 10 students have been busily working through the Term 1 Common Assessment Task (CAT) period. The use of CAT's for students assessment is an opportunity for students to demonstrate key skills and knowledge for each subject area. The CAT's are based on all of the teaching and learning that has occurred so far in Term 1. At the end of the CAT period staff will moderate and assess student work for consistency of assessment results. The moderation process is highly important to the College as it assists in ensuring the learning focus and expectations of achievement are clearly understood and communicated with consistency. It also informs an evaluation of the teaching and learning program. The use of an ongoing evaluation helps to inform continual improvements. The moderation sessions will take place in early term 2 and I will be working with School Council regarding some early finishes to class times on these days to ensure the work is able to be completed by staff.

#### **School Assembly**

It was my pleasure recently to be part of the first of the whole school assembly at the College for 2021. The assembly was organized by our student leaders and included performances, celebration of student results from 2020 as well as messages from our student leadership team. The ability for the students and staff to come together in this way is highly valuable and will become more commonplace over the next 12 to 24 months. Students and staff are looking forward to being able to come together more easily and in greater comfort when the new gymnasium facility is completed.

#### **School Council**

The new school council is almost formed with one parent representative position available. Any parents that would like to be involved are encouraged to contact the main office to register their interest or to speak with me directly regarding further details.

#### School Gymnasium and Performing Arts upgrade



# **Tutor Learning Initiative Program 2021**

Our school will be providing over 200 students with additional targeted learning support. This extra support is available through the Victorian Government's \$250 million investment in the Tutor Learning Initiative (TLI), which supports schools to address disruptions to students' learning as a result of COVID-19.

The Tutor Learning Initiative enables schools across Victoria to engage qualified teachers as tutors to work with small groups of students and support their learning. The initiative is consistent with Australian and international evidence, which shows that small group tutoring is one of the most effective educational interventions available to support students to progress in their learning.

The Tutor Learning Initiative teacher will work with selected students to understand their literacy and numeracy progress to date and set goals for future learning.

The TLI teacher will also work with each student's regular classroom teachers to minimise disruptions, ensure the program complements the standard curriculum, and support the classroom lessons. The TLI teacher will support each student in a small group setting of up to five students by working with them directly in class.

This tutoring support will be provided for two periods, and small group learning sessions will occur twice a week. Student progress will be monitored as part of the program and updates about their progress will be available throughout the year.




# **Student Leadership Prospectus**

#### **Class Captains**



Class captains take on extra responsibilities as set by classroom teacher. The class captains work with the SRC to fulfill the College goals at the classroom level. Class Captains are actively involved with their teachers in the curriculum design and Positive Behaviour Support. A class captain is a representative of the class and assists with assemblies and school events.

#### **Teach the Teacher**

The Teach the Teacher program has provided more opportunities for students and teachers to work together to discuss teaching and learning, and has provided a framework for students to conduct their own research, investigate current educational research, and use their findings to work together with their peers to plan and provide professional learning for staff.

The Teach the Teacher Program is designed to develop students' personal leadership, communication and problem solving skills. Students have the opportunity to engage in peer-to-peer teaching and learning and build on their strengths to develop:

- · an understanding of student voice and representation
- · a greater understanding of teaching and learning
- their potential to be leaders through a student-led professional learning session
- their own unique approach to leadership
- an increased understanding of their personal strengths and skills
- · effective communication skills
- a willingness to create a more inclusive school culture

## Science/ STEM News

#### Last Friday saw my Year 11 Psychology class dig into some brains!!!

The students loved putting their theoretical knowledge of the structure and function of the human brain into practice (even though we used sheep brains!). Over the coming weeks, look out for more Science and STEM student work in action!

#### **International Women's Day**

Week 7 was a busy week for STEM. On Tuesday 9th March, we celebrated International Women's Day by hosting a Girls in STEM lunchtime event. Select female students from the Year 7 and 8 Academic Excellence Program, along with Year 9 and 10 STEM classes, gathered in W4 to enjoy some food and drink. They listened to our special guest speaker, Dr Amany Abdelkader, a lecturer and researcher in Anatomy and Physiology from Federation

University, give a very moving and inspirational speech about her passion for STEM and her journey towards a highly successful career. When students asked Dr Amany for her advice on girls studying at school, Dr Amany told the girls to 'never let anyone tell you that you can't achieve something, but you do need to work hard!'

A very big thanks to those who were involved in helping with the organising of the event and making sure it ran smoothly – Carren Brennan, Shannon Pook and Jen Rice. Thank you also to our wonderful and inspiring STEM teachers Rika Amvrosiadis and Mrudula Menon, who were there to show their support.







#### **Casey Technical School**

In a separate event on Wednesday 10th March, Year 9 and 10 STEM students had the privilege of attending Casey Technical School in Berwick to participate in a 'Discovery Program'. Students worked in groups and rotated through four different activities using the design thinking process, each one challenging their critical and creative thinking skills! Students were able to participate in activities using Hummingbird engineering and robotics technology, forming objects to float through a wind tunnel, coding a set of instructions to successfully operate drones, and creating all sorts of imagery in 3D space using Virtual Reality (VR) headsets and hand controllers.

Aliza Kumari of 10G had this to say: "I had a great experience. We did very interesting activities and I've learned new things from them. My favourite was the VR class."

And Sanjana Garaga of 9A said this: "First of all, thank you so much for giving us this wonderful opportunity, we love the experience and would love to visit it again.

My friends and I mostly enjoyed the drones session because we learnt that controlling a drone with a tab is cool, and the Visual gamer session because it felt

like a whole other world. We had so much fun, the staff were really nice, respectable and patient. I think it is a wonderful place with so many fun activities that keep students engaged and entertained."

A massive thank you to Rika Amvrosiadis, STEM Learning Area Coordinator, for organising and overseeing this excursion, along with Mrudula Menon and Jen Rice who helped support the students. A very successful day indeed!









#### Job Club

Are you looking for part time work or would you like some help with writing a resume, designing a cover letter or making a phone call to an employer. Or maybe you would like to help somebody film their Visual Resume?

Mrs Brennan and the rest of the Careers Team meet every couple of Fridays at lunchtime to go over anything and everything to do with looking for a job. We have a Teams Group where you can contact Pathways directly, and where you can access resources to do with job hunting. We have recently looked at the search engine <a href="www.indeed.com">www.indeed.com</a> and also how to complete an application form for a fast food restaurant, and previously we have used a template to help write a resume.

All students are welcome to attend – in the Careers room at lunchtimes every second Friday (or so!) Keep an eye out for a notice in the newsfeed.

#### **Careers Counselling Appointments**

Individual Year 12 VCE career counselling appointments are well underway with approximately 70% of students having already met with Michelle Graco, our VCE Career Practitioner. Prior to the appointment, students complete their online "My Career Portfolio" which incorporates their Career Action Plan, an important resource for goal setting and planning for future career options. In their meeting, students are then able to begin the research and exploration towards finalising the steps involved to reach these goals. This may include the VTAC application process for university and TAFE courses, direct applications to institutes, building their resume for employment or apprenticeships, researching options for the Defence Force/Police Force or looking at having a Gap year and what that entails.

We also distribute a fortnightly careers newsletter which can be found on the Compass newsfeed; all current and back editions can also be found on our careers webpage. Our careers resource centre in W block is open to all students as a drop in centre during recess and lunch breaks, as well as before Form Assembly and after school. #### Morrisby Online Assessments

The Year 9 students sat for the Morrisby Online Assessment in the last week of February. This is a great experience for our Year 9 students on deciding what to do after they leave school as it is not always an easy decision.

The Morrisby is a useful career tool that helps students to feel inspired and provide guidance. It collects information on the student's abilities, interests and personality and provides a range of career suggestions that may be suited to them.

We have had 244 students complete the assessment and now move on to the next stage which is the careers consultant appointments. All students have been allocated an appointment time and should appear on their Compass schedule. Appointments will begin on 17th March and continue to the end of the term.




# Dear Compass user,




