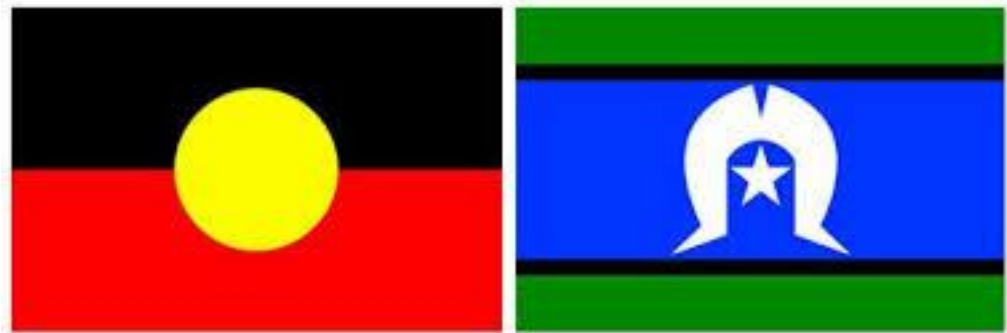

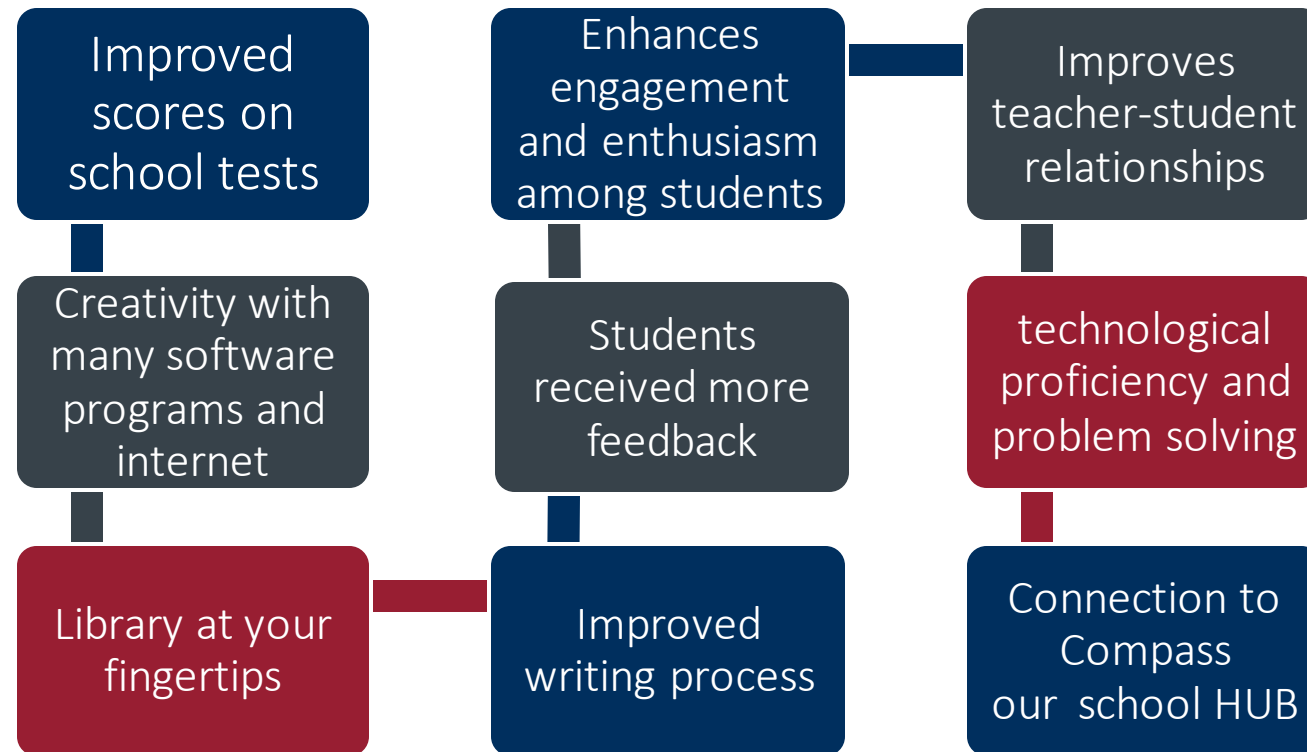

Student Representative Council



- Student Leadership at our school begins with the important job of electing Year Level Leaders across our college for the SRC.
- Students are able to nominate themselves or be nominated by a teacher or student, our interview process is fully student run.
- SRC students meet once a week during lunchtime where they plan leadership initiatives across our college. Students discuss what their goals are for the year and they put steps in place to plan whole school events such as fundraisers, sports and celebrations.
- All students are given opportunities throughout the year to develop their leadership at Cranbourne Secondary College.

MultiPride



MultiPride is all about young people from culturally diverse backgrounds taking the lead in shaping our college culture they want to be a part of.

Students know that if they're experiencing racism, or bullying of any kind, they've got someone they can go to, someone in a MultiPride jumper. They've got a place they can go if they're committed to solving tensions with words, rather than acting out physically.



Class Captains

- The Teach the Teacher Program is designed to develop students' personal leadership, communication and problem solving skills.



Principal's Reference Group

- Principal Reference Group is smaller number of students across year levels who meet with our Principal and our staff leader for Student Voice Agency and Leadership fortnightly to have a direct connection with the leadership of our college.
- We meet as equals over lunch and discuss issues arising candidly and confidently in the spirit of collaboration to do our best for our school community.
- We investigate and unpack school data like the Attitude to School Survey and share wonderings and perspectives.



Data Literate Students

- We believe to empower our students to be the best learners they can be and achieve their goals we need to teach them about what their learning data tells them about their learning journey.
- In 2023 our college introduced the Literatu program. A program that allows students to view their individual NAPLAN, PAT and CAT data and dig deeper to see their strengths, areas for improvement and set goals.
- We believe in the benefits of personalizing data which can increase student engagement and have a positive impact on school culture.

Empowering Learners Program

Purpose

To support student induction and transitions into the College we have designed a program that aims to provide appropriate personal, social and academic supports. To formalise and respond to this need, the College is introducing a formal transition program across the College called *Empowering Learners*.

Black, navy or white head bands, hair ribbons, “scrunchies” or headwear worn as part of cultural/religious beliefs

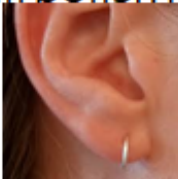
Plain, black hat with school logo may be worn outdoors

Students are not permitted to wear decorative jewellery to school. Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, watches, and one facial piercing are the only acceptable jewellery. Make-up, hair and nail polish must be natural and in neutral tones.

Orientation Day- Tuesday 13th December

- The day will begin at 9am in the College Theatre. Students will be dismissed from the College Theatre at 2:30pm.
- Parents are asked not to enter school grounds. Staff will be there to direct and assist students on the day.
- Students should wear primary school uniform and bring with them a backpack with a water bottle, snack, lunch and a pencil case and notebook.

First Day- Tuesday 31st January

- We will begin our day in the Junior School courtyard for our Welcome breakfast at 8:15am. We invite everyone to attend and a light breakfast will be provided.
- Students must be at school no later than 8:40am.
- We expect students to be in full school uniform. They should bring a bag, drink bottle, their snack/lunch, a pencil case, and some notebooks. Students do not need to bring all of their books on the first day.
